16_3_English 酒井神社 本殿 Sakai Shrine - Main Sanctuary Designated Tangible Cultural Property of Shiga Prefecture [1620]

Sakai Shrine's Main Sanctuary is a large scale building constructed in the nagare-zukuri style of Japanese architecture, which is characterized by an asymmetrical gabled roof. The Main Sanctuary roof was made using many layers of bark from Japanese cypress trees, and was constructed concurrently with Ryosha Shrine in 1620 by Nagaakira Asano of the Hiroshima domain. While some details differ, it shares the same overall structure as the neighboring Ryosha Shrine's Main Sanctuary, and is a characteristic building of the early Edo period [1603–1868].
