Shojuraikoji Temple's Reception Hall was built around 1639, and is a typical early Edo Period [1603–1867] reception hall. The roof of the Reception Hall differs in shape and material from north to south, with the south side of the building having a hip-and-gable roof with wooden shingles, and the north side having a gabled roof with ceramic tiling. Some of the paintings on the interior walls of the building were also done by Kano Tanyu, a member of the Kano school (one of Japan's leading groups of artists).
