The Founder's Hall of Shojuraikoji Temple is a square shaped building with a hip-and-gable roof that uses ceramic tiles. Shojuraikoji Temple was originally known as "Jizo-kyoin," but was later changed to Shojuraikoji in 1001 by the monk Genshin when he enshrined the Amida Buddha. In addition to Genshin, the monk Tenkai and Tokugawa Ieyasu, the first shogun of the Edo Shogunate, are also enshrined in the Founder's Hall.
