Daikyojino Temple Ruins

At the Daikyojino Temple Ruins, it has been confirmed that a main building was constructed on the temple's foundational platform, and pottery dating from the mid-9th century to early-10th century has been unearthed, indicating that this was an ancient temple. The 1 meter tall foundational platform is 14 meters wide east to west, and 10.5 meters long north to south. Pottery engraved with the word "Unzen" written in ink was excavated from the scraped area northwest of the foundational platform. The roof of the building is thought to have been wooden, with a cypress bark or shingled roof, however no roof tiles have ever been successfully excavated.
