Tofu Shrine, a subsidiary shrine within the grounds of Ono Shrine - Main Hall

The construction of Ono Shrine's main hall is a rarity in Japan due to its gabled roof and "Hirairi" layout, which is a Japanese traditional architectural structure where the building has its main entrance on the side which runs parallel to the roof's ridge. The main hall was constructed in 1341, and its enshrined deity is the grandchild of Ono no Takamura, Ono no Tofu (also known as Ono no Michikaze) [894-966], who was a calligrapher in Japan's Heian period [794-1185], and revered as one of "the three great calligraphers" of his time. It was designated an Important Cultural Property in 1907.
