3_4_English_和邇大塚山古墳 Wani Otsukayama Burial Mound Important Cultural Property [Around 1639]

The Wani Otsukayama Burial Mound is a 72-meter-long, 50-meter in diameter keyhole-shaped burial mound on the north side of the summit of the 191-meter-high Mt. Mandara, and offers a panoramic view of the Ono area below. The burial mound was discovered by local residents in 1907 along with a wide variety of grave goods such as mirrors, magatama (commashaped beads from prehistoric Japan), swords, armor, and earthenware. It is estimated to have been constructed in the middle to late Kofun period (around 350-400).
