Wani Otsukayama Burial Mound

Important Cultural Property

[Around 1639]

The Wani Otsukayama Burial Mound is a 72-meter-long, 50-meter in diameter keyhole-shaped burial mound on the north side of the summit of the 191-meter-high Mt. Mandara, and offers a panoramic view of the Ono area below. The burial mound was discovered by local residents in 1907 along with a wide variety of grave goods such as mirrors, magatama (comma-shaped beads from prehistoric Japan), swords, armor, and earthenware. It is estimated to have been constructed in the middle to late Kofun period (around 350-400).
