5_3_ English_明王院本堂 Myououin Temple - Main Hall Important Cultural Property [A.D.1715]

Myououin Temple was constructed in the Jogan Era [859–877] by the monk Souou Kasho as a training hall for spiritual training based on the Tendai sect of Buddhism. It currently persists as an active training ground for the Tendai practice of "Kaihougyo," which is a thousand-day walk through Mt. Hiei. The main hall sports a hip-and-gable roof that uses Japanese horse chestnut shingles, and was constructed in 1715. It was designated an Important Cultural Property in 1993.
